**1** Look at the page about pigs and piglets (pages 12–13). What pictures can you see in the yellow bar at the bottom of the page? Compare this to pages for other animals in the book. What do you notice?

**2** Read about lambs on pages 20–21. What do lambs like to drink? What type of fur are their bodies covered in?

**3** Look at the page about rabbits (pages 22–23). What can you see in the picture? What is the boy doing? Why is the boy doing this?

**4** Turn to the page about guinea pigs (pages 24–25). What information do you get from the text? What information do you get from the picture and labels? Is it different information?

**5** Read about geese on pages 26–27. What is “bill” another name for? How do you know this from this page?

- 1 pictures of pigs and piglets; the colored bar always has several pictures of the animal on that page
- 2 milk; wool
- 3 A boy feeding a carrot to a rabbit; The rabbit is hungry.
- 4 Guinea pigs are fluffy and like to eat leaves; Guinea pigs have whiskers and claws; yes.
- 5 A beak; The label on the picture is pointing to the bill / beak.
